History

We found the first traces of Château d'Eyran in the 13th century.

In 1796, he became the property of the family de Seze that owns it again today. This is one of the few properties to be passed from generation to generation over such a long period. Raymond de Seze, a prominent magistrate, courageously defended King Louis XVI at his trial in 1792. He was honored for his courage in 1817 by King Louis XVIII and received the title of Comte.

Since 1984, the restoration of the Domain is carried out by Brigitte and Stéphane Savignaux.

The Château d'Eyran is on a gravelly hilltop of Saint Medard D'Eyrans, a small village located next to Bordeaux.

Wine making

After manual grape harvesting, traditional winemaking and wine maturation during one year in oak barrels, these are fine wines of considerable character.

Soils - Geology

The 20 hectare vineyard is on a sandy and argilo-limestone ground called "graves".

Ageing :

12 months in oak barrels

Grape :

50% Cabernet Sauvignon, 45% Merlot and a small 5% of Verdot.

Cellaring : 10 years

Tasting note:

Rich, round soft tannins, concentrated deep colour red fruits, and cacao flavour with long finish and soft well balanced oaked tannins.

Food:

Traditional food, roasted beef or with a cheese platter.
